Important Information to all owners:

If you oppose rent control, vote no on Prop. 33

Important to all owners that have properties in the city limits of Salinas or live in Salinas: the new rent control legislation is disastrous. The only way to potentially get relief is to elect new members to the city council. Our recommendations are: Mayor, Dennis Donahue; District 1, Jose Barajas; District3, Margaret D'Arrigo; District 4, Gloria De La Rosa; District 6, Aurelio Salazar.

As mentioned during the meeting, changing the composition of the Salinas City Council is a critical step in achieving our goals. <u>Below are key reasons why this change is urgently needed:</u>

- Salinas is in a Leadership Crisis: The current City Council majority has demonstrated an antibusiness, anti-agriculture, and anti-police stance, which is creating significant challenges for property owners and the broader community.
- **Ultra-Progressive Policies:** Proposals like defunding the police and rent control are gaining traction. These measures threaten both safety and property rights, potentially devaluing investments and discouraging new businesses from coming to Salinas.
- Agricultural Tax Threat: A councilmember has publicly supported a city-wide agricultural tax, which could drive up costs for property owners and have a detrimental effect on the Salinas Valley's agricultural economy—a vital part of our region's identity and livelihood.
- Water Policy at Risk: The mayor was recently removed from Monterey One's Water board, replaced by a young, inexperienced councilmember. This individual has signaled a willingness to prioritize the water needs of the Peninsula over the Salinas Valley, risking our water supply and undermining the farming industry that depends on it.
- Long-Term Consequences for Future Generations: The decisions being made today will have lasting impacts on property owners, particularly in terms of water rights and local policy. These changes could reshape the agricultural and business landscape of the Salinas Valley for decades.


